WHAT IS XYLAZINE?

[XYLAZINE](#) is a large animal tranquilizer with sedative and muscle relaxant properties increasingly found in heroin, cocaine, meth, and fentanyl.

[XYLAZINE POISONING](#)

Can cause respiratory depression and heavy sedation, similar to an opioid overdose, as well as skin lesions. Seek out immediate medical attention for wounds that are hard to heal and are out of the ordinary.

HOW CAN I STAY SAFE?



[TAKE YOUR TIME](#)

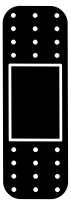
Take control by taking your time. Start small and go slow.



[SYRINGE SAFETY 1](#)

After drawing your substance into the syringe, wipe the tip with an alcohol pad before injecting.

After you inject, leave the syringe inside your vein for 5 full seconds before withdrawing. This reduces the chance of Xylazine leaking out of your vein and potentially causing an abscess.



[SYRINGE SAFETY 2](#)

Xylazine makes it more important to secure your vein with a tourniquet. A missed shot containing Xylazine can cause severe abscesses. If you are using a supply that might contain Xylazine, it is important to tend to any openings in your skin, even if they are small.



[SECONDS COUNT](#)

Narcan alone can not reverse the effects of Xylazine. Seek immediate medical attention if you suspect a Xylazine overdose. The NH Good Samaritan law protects overdose victims from prosecution for small amounts of drugs and paraphernalia.
